Seven Hills High School has undertaken a new initiative, the Student and Parent Portal, to provide both parents and students discreet information about each student's progress. Access to the portal will be through the following internet address: -

http://web1.sevenhillsh.schools.nsw.edu.au/portal/login

Information accessible from the portal will include student timetable details, daily notices applicable to students, attendance details, important school documents relative to each year group and the whole school, school newsletters, details of N Awards for Years 9 and 10 students, current and past academic reports including semester and RTA reports, and past NAPLAN results. In addition, parents/carers will be able to inform the school of updated contact and medical details through the portal. For parents/carers with more than one student at the school, the one portal account will have access to all.

For the parent portal, the registration process along with details of how to access the portal has been provided to each family through a mailed letter containing access details including an access key. A valid email address is required as a username, however. Upon receiving this letter, please register your account to begin access to the parent portal.



Our first workshop was with an Indigenous elder who told us some dream-time stories. He was 94 years old and his stories were very interesting.



The dancing workshop was interesting with Mr Burgess showing proficiency in dancing as a Kangaroo and an Emu and Logan handled the dancing with real panache. We then moved to a woodcarving workshop and finally, beading, where we learned the importance of weaving and beading to the Indigenous people.

Overall the day was a huge success and we all learned a lot about the oldest living culture on earth.

Year 7 Self-Select Class - Project Based Learning Initiative

On 22 August, a team of students representing the Year 7 Self-Select Class presented their Project Design outline to the school's executive and leaders.

The students were commissioned to successfully design a pleasant and fun outdoor learning classroom space for students and teachers, to be located outside the entry to the Science and Library block.

The team - Annie Kereopa. James Strachan, Kyle Cavanagh, Brianna Seaman, Richard Lee and Holmes - reasoned that many people would be able to use this area in the future learning for activities. Teachers, students and the community could engage in learning in this flexible space.

The students considered the current area and thought it was dark and uninviting as a learning area. "There is little in this area of interest and it doesn't stimulate thinking, reflecting, creating or learning."

Richard Lee suggested: "If a bright, vivid and flexible purpose area was created in this space, teachers, students and community groups would be more encouraged to be involved and engaged in learning."













The students used a flexible design for their suggested floor plan. They explored the costings of implementing their design and worked to utilise a set budget and meet deadlines to be ready to present their initiative.
