

It was so wonderful to welcome Vardy's Road primary students last week as part of our Smooth Walking program. This program is designed to assist young student's transition to high school.



### **Streamwatch News**

Every fortnight, the Streamwatch team from Seven Hills High School undertakes physical and chemical testing of Lalor Creek, which flows through Twin Gums Reserve. These tests include temperature, pH, electrical conductivity, turbidity, available phosphate, dissolved oxygen and macro invertebrate (water bug) surveys. Students learn to interpret their test results and understand how activities impact on water quality in their local area.

We recently carried out our spring water bug survey. The water bugs were well hidden under plants and rocks, however, the students managed to catch several dragonfly nymph and many of the feral Gumbusia fish also known as the plague minnow. These fish were introduced from South America as a biological control for mosquitoes, however, this was unsuccessful. The fish are now a noxious pest with a varied diet feeding on our native insect larvae, insects, plants, worms and frog eggs.

We will carry out another bug testing survey in Term 4.

## Food Technology in November

8 Tech 1 have been hard at work planning their restaurant design folio. Students had to create a restaurant with a theme, uniform, menu and then prepare a dish, as a practical assessment. The students did extremely well in the kitchen, demonstrating organisation and proficient cooking skills. There were a variety of dishes created including – steak and sweet potato fries, pizza, spaghetti bolognaise, loaded fries and chocolate milkshakes, maple rice pudding and gluten free tiramisu.



Year 9 were involved in an innovation practical assessment to assess not only their cooking skills, but also their creativeness.

Students were given a list of ingredients and they had to create a dish from that list. They were also allowed to bring in three ingredients of their own. We had a range of amazing dishes produced, such as chicken burger and fries, pesto zucchini pasta and chicken, cheesy chicken and rice, garlic honey stir-fry, chicken carbonara and pasta alfredo, just to name a few.







I have been very impressed by the cooking skills of all students, which have improved throughout the semester. It is also pleasing to see students rise to the challenge when they are pushed out of their comfort zone.

I am looking forward to the achievements in 7 Tech 5 and the Year 10 Food Technology class, as they prepare for their assessment tasks.

AL SHUSTE


The Upside of Unrequited By Becky Albertalli. (2017)
