Mrs Howell, Christine and Kyle's iSTEM teacher, was also named one of Microsoft's 'Teachers of the Year'.

Christine and Kyle not only received trophies, but each received a Surface Pro and the opportunity to be mentored by the Head of Accessibility at Microsoft, who is in Seattle USA.
